and the families from exposure. Tuberculosis can be cleared from the face of the earth if all cases are discovered in the early stages and isolated in a sanatorium, and actively treated there. Almost one hundred percent will get well if discovered early in the disease. It all depends upon early discovery, a program we are trying to follow in our health district.

Here is where the catch comes, the films cost around \$1.00 each for adults and 75c each for children. Chemicals cost about \$6.00 per change of solution, and this must be changed about every month. Now and then a tube breaks and they cost \$85.00 each. We are now out of funds and hereafter cannot make films without collecting \$1.00 each. We far prefer to take them free of charge, but cannot do so. If any clubs, civic organizations, or any other groups should feel able to assist us in buying films, we would again welcome the opportunity to make films free.

After the patients are sent to the sanatorium, the family, in most cases, can pay the small fee for their care. If unable to do so, the Welfare Department should be placed in position to assume this obligation. The Seal Sale Committee in Yancey county gave us \$50.00 this year, Avery county gave \$35.00 and Mitchell county none. This drop from \$473.00 last year to \$85.00 this year accounts for our failing to make films free. (District Health Office)
