HOME AGENTS NOTES

Did late blight destroy your tomato crop last year? If you live in the Mountain area and did not dust or spray your plants to control the disease, there were few tomatoes fresh for the table and for canning. Can you afford not to have tomatoes this year? Let's do something about it!

LATE BLIGHT and other leaf diseases that destroy tomato plants and fruits can be controlled by properly spraying or dusting the plants with reliable materials.

SPRAYS OR DUSTS? Sprays usually give some better results and are cheaper to use. However, dusts can be more easily and quickly applied than sprays and will give satisfactory control when properly used.

Materials to Use
In order of preference the following materials are recommended:

Sprays: Yellow Cuprocide, Compound-A (Copper Tri-Basic Copper Sulphate 4-3-50 Bordeaux; Dusts: Yellow Cuprocide Compound-A Tri-Basic Copper Sulphate Bordeaux (Copper-lime).

When to Spray or Dust
In the Mountain and upper Piedmont areas, start when the growing plants

**COMING SOON!
CANNING SEASON**

Since so much of our food is being sent overseas to feed our starving nations each housewife will want to plan to fill her storage space completely with jars of fruits and vegetables this summer.

Now is a good time to check your canning equipment. Every jar should be gone over to be sure the jar is smooth and free of nicks. You should also make plans to get the new jars, caps and rings that you will be needing. The screw bands on your self-sealing jars may be used over and over again but the caps must be new ones.

Not only should you check your jars, caps and rings, but your pressure cooker or your hot water kettle. Be sure that it will be deep enough for the water to come up an inch over the top of the jars and that you have a false bot-

tom for it. A thin piece of wood is good to use. Ask your jar dealer for a Home Canning Guide which will be of much help in canning.

**RECORD COVER CROPS
PLANNED FOR STATE**

Agronomist Roy L. Lovvorn of the State College Extension Service has reported that North Carolina's farmers plan record planting of cover crops next fall and reminded that farmers who set aside definite acreages of these crops for seed will have the upper hand in supplying the expected fall demand for good seed.

A record production of food crops also is in prospect as indicated by the fact that to date 87 per cent of the state's 244,000 farm operators have signed requests for assistance through the Agricultural Conservation program this year.

It is expected that more than 15,000,000 pounds of seed will be planted to winter cover crops this year as farmers seek to add depleted nitrogen to the soil and protect it through the winter. Prospects are that 280,000 acres will be seeded to Austrian winter peas, 40,000 acres to vetch, 117,000 acres to crimson clover, and 68,000 acres to rye grass.

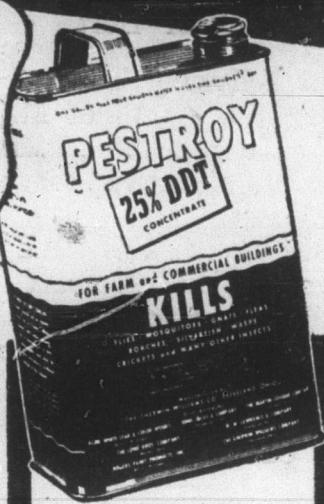
The state was able to use but 78 per cent of its soil conservation assistance allotment in 1945 because of a ruling which tagged funds as non-transferrable, preventing the reallocation of money from cropland even though it was not in cultivation. A more flexible plan of conservation assistance has been provided this year and PMA leaders say that it will permit the use of "every penny" of the \$6,301,000 allocated for the rejuvenation of farmland, dissipated by wartime production. Farmers must file conservation assistance requests prior to June 1.

The quantity and variety of winter cover crop seed which will be made available under the 1946 conservation program will be announced at an early date, Lovvorn said.
