Burnsville High School

The school term of 1946-47 began August 12, with 564 pupils enrolled in the elementary grades and 158 in high school. This is the largest enrollment on record.

The school lunchroom opened last week with an average of 600 lunches served each day.

A special activity has been planned for all students. There will be a different activity each day. One

day has been set aside for chapel, another for physical education, one for individual class meetings, one for softball and various games, and the other for clubs.

Student government will be established in high school this year. The students and teachers have already been discussing plans for it.

With the agricultural class added to the school program, the future farmers of Yancey county should have brighter prospects

District Health Department

All schools in the three counties in our Health District will be open by August 26th. The health program has already started in the Yancey county schools, and will be continued throughout the school year. Health education is the primary purpose of the health program, and people are most receptive to education in childhood, and particularly during school age. For this reason we spend a large amount of time and work in the schools.

In order to enter school in North Carolina, the State law requires that every child shall be vaccinated against diphtheria and smallpox, and must be immunized against whooping cough, either by vaccination or by having had the disease.

The actual work in the schools includes the Schick test for the first grade to make sure that each child is protected from the dread disease of diphtheria. A child with a positive reaction is again given the diphtheria toxoid.

Children in the grades and in high school are examined for a smallpox scar and if none is found they are given this vaccination.

The health officer will make a physical examination of all children in the first and third grades this year. The parents are noti-

fied of correctable defects and are urged to have them corrected. We hope that the parents will realize the importance of these recommendations, as they are given by a physician of many years of private practice, and we feel that they are worthy of serious consideration. When a child is found to have a heart disease the probable cause is ascertained, and recommendation is made that this cause be removed. In such cases our nurses visit the homes and personally urge the correction of the defect.

In the case of head or body lice or itch (scabies), we require that the child having either of the above remain away from school until the disease is cured. Specific written directions as to the cure of itch are sent to the parents, and when followed implicitly this disease is cured permanently.

The health department keeps boxes of DDT powder which cost 15c each. This powder will positively cure head lice if used two or three times, a week apart, by all members of the family.

We hope that no parents will resent our bringing these two diseases to their attention and we feel sure that no one desires to have them
