"For your information, you must immediately bring to the teacher a certificate from a licensed physician, that all of these vaccinations have been given. We will wait until October 7th for you to get these certificates in. If you do not present these certificates, we will instruct the Principal of the school to send the child home until you are able to present these certificates."


