THE FSA PROGRAM IN YANCEY COUNTY

Some objectives of the F. S. A. program in the county were reported last week. Among the other accomplishments during the past ten years are the following:

6. Promotion of Family Health: By advocating a well-balanced diet and three good meals daily, the health of the average family has greatly improved. All houses are recommended for screening and all springs and water supplies being in good condition to meet minimum State health requirements.

Over 75 families consisting of 450 people have participated in the Hospital and Surgical Insurance Program, with many families having their entire bills paid when attending hospitals during illness.

7. Home Improvement: During the past 5 years over 100 modern storage houses have been built by FSA families. Approximately 150 houses have been remodeled and repaired; some have had additional rooms added, while others have been completely renovated.

8. Participation in Group Services: In many instances small groups of farmers have pooled their resources and purchased purebred sires, machinery and other farm implements that one farmer could not afford.

GOOD HEALTH ASSOCIATION WILL OPEN CAMPAIGN

Durham — The North Carolina Good Health Association's educational publicity campaign will get its official kick-off Saturday night, Nov. 9 at 7 o'clock with a live talent broadcast direct from Hollywood, Good Health headquarters here announced today.

Appearing on the show in addition to a host of Hollywood stars will be Gov. Gregg Cherry of North Carolina and Dr. I. G. Greer, of Thomasville, President of the Good Health Association.

Kay Kyser, the "Old Professor" of Musical Knowledge from Rocky Mount, will serve as master of ceremonies, and will be assisted by his band.

More than a million listeners are expected to tune in the show, which will be the first radio program ever to be brought to an all North Carolina hookup via direct leased wire from Hollywood.

Over 50 such services have been organized in Yancey county. This not only has helped in the production of better livestock, having better farming machinery, but also has helped to develop a better cooperative community spirit.

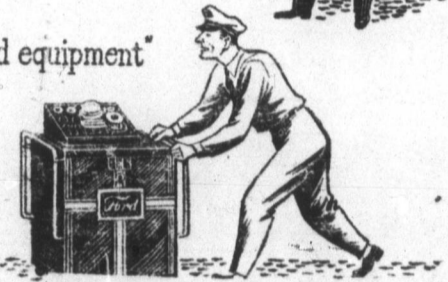
