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School Lunch Program

On Monday a bill was introduced in the U. S. Senate to appropriate an additional \$10,000,000 for school lunches during the remainder of the current fiscal year.

If this appropriation is made, it will enable the school lunch program to be continued without interruption. Many states have reported to the department of agriculture that funds

had already been exhausted or would be exhausted before the end of the school term.

The proposal is good news for the schools. The problem of raising the health standards among school children of the nation has been of vital concern, and no program has been of greater aid than the lunch program. Without federal aid, an added burden would be placed on communities,

SOCIAL SECURITY AND THE VETERAN

"Who is eligible for payments of Old-Age and Survivors Insurance under the 1946 veterans' amendment to the Social Security Act?"

If the veteran's military record was such that it qualifies his survivors for Old-Age Insurance payments and he leaves a widow with young children in her care, she will be eligible to receive monthly benefits and each child under 18 may also receive monthly payments. As each child reaches the age of 18, his benefits will stop. When all of the children have reached their 18th birthday, the widow's benefit will stop if she is under 65 years of age. But when she reaches the age of 65, she can again file claim for benefits, which will continue for the rest of her life. The widow, however, will lose all rights to benefits, if she remarries.

be about 100 times as strong as the static to come in clearly. But in FM reception this ratio is reduced to two to one.

2. Fading—is wholly absent on FM because of its short wave-length band. Fading is a phenomenon of all AM or long wave-length broadcasting in which a program comes in with tremendous volume for a short time and then decreases imperceptibly into small volume. It is due to the interaction of two waves, one conducted along the ground and the other through the air, which are sent out from the broadcasting station and intercepted by the AM receiver.

Sometimes the sky wave reflected back to the earth reinforces the ground wave causing great volume; at other times it neutralizes the ground wave, causing it to fade. Since there is no sky wave reflected back in FM reception, the FM listener never suffers the torture of fading.

3. Daytime - Nighttime Coverage — The effective service area of an FM station is constant—it does not vary from day to night. In FM, the ground signal is the only signal to reach the receiver; there is no sky wave propagation as there is in AM broadcasting (as explained above).

4. Selectivity—FM has complete selectivity, thus interference from any competing broadcasting station is eliminated. If two FM stations are on the same wave-length, the stronger wave is received and amplified and the weaker one is totally submerged.

5. High-Fidelity — FM's three freedoms — freedom from static, freedom from interference of other stations, and freedom from distortion—have permitted FM to use the entire spectrum of audible vibrations in the production of music.

FM, by using the short wave, is enabled to take full advantage of its ability to preserve all the overtones which give musical instruments their individual characteristics and the speaking and singing voice the full range of their natural qualities. Music lovers particularly appreciate FM's fidelity of voice reproduction with the absence of background noises.
