Will Move to Florida

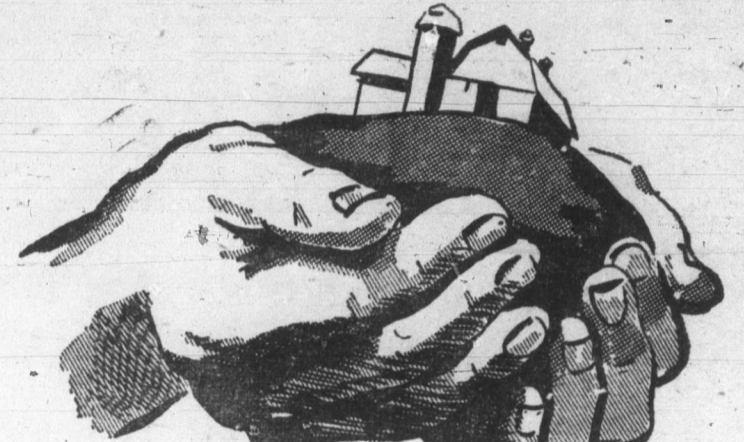
