## DECLARE DIVIDEND

The Board of Directors of the Farmers Federation in a meeting Tuesday morning declared the 29th consecutive semi-annual dividend on common and preferred stock payable July 1 to all stockholders of record June 15, it has been announced by James G. K. McClure, president of the organization.

Mr. McClure stated that there are more than 20,000 stockholders of the federation in 18 Western North Carolina counties at present. The federation, he said, now markets more than three million dollars worth of produce for the Western North Carolina farmer annually and has provided services such as freezer-locker plants, a modern poultry processing plant, Southeastern Artificial Breeding association and Skyline Cooperative dairies.
