graph to be used in connection with these events. Should a candidate use all her ballots, she may secure additional ballots by writing to the Tobacco Queen Contest, Box 449, Asheville, N C., and requesting additional ballots. Prizes worth over \$300 will be awarded the queen and she will be honor guest at a number of events.
