FARM AND HOME WEEK
PLANS MADE FOR 1949

Plans for an outstanding North Carolina Farm and Home Week program for 1949 were made by State College officials and agricultural leaders of the State in a recent meeting at the College.

Date for the event was set as the second week in August, which is about two weeks earlier than usual. Beginning on Monday, August 8, and continuing through Thursday evening, August 11, the program will include general sessions and subject matter discussions each morning; tours, demonstrations, and visits to exhibits each afternoon; and addresses and recreational features each evening.

Several internationally known speakers will be invited to give addresses or lead discussions. Principal speakers at the last Farm and Home Week, held in 1947, were General Dwight Eisenhower and Columnist Dorothy Thompson.

On Thursday evening the principal feature will be an educational program on farm and home mechanization during which several thousand dollars worth of prizes will be awarded. An effort will be made to have this program handled by personnel of a well-known national radio quiz show and possibly have it broadcast on a coast-to-coast hookup.

Gold Star Buttons Are Available

Gold Star Lapel Buttons are now available without charge to widows and parents of those members of the armed forces who lost their lives in World War II, according to Jack C. Winchester, district officer of the State Commission.

Those desiring to apply for one of these Gold Star Buttons will be furnished application blanks and any assistance necessary in completing them, Winchester said.

Farm and Home Week was not held in 1948 because of the polio epidemic. The event normally attracts more than 5,000 farmers and home-makers from all parts of the State.

The planning meeting held recently was presided over by Roy Lohr of Lexington, president of the State Farmers Convention. John W. Goodman, assistant director of the State College Extension Service and secretary of Farm and Home Week, led the discussion of program plans. Among other persons attending were representatives of the College, the State Department of Agriculture, the State Federation of Home Demonstration Clubs, and other agencies.

Bald Creek Seniors To Present Play Tonight

Do you like a good mystery story? Most people do, including those in all walks of life, from president down. And the same is true of stage plays. Who doesn't enjoy the suspense, the thrill of a sudden scream, the chill of a corpse in a darkened room? All this and more is to be found in the forthcoming production of the Bald Creek Senior Play, "Mumbo-Jumbo," a play in three acts by Jack Barnard.

The recent stage hit has already won for itself a reputation of being one of the most entertaining and ingenious mystery farces to come along in many seasons. It has murders, and murders that turn out to be not murders, throbbing African Voodoo rites, a mysterious blind man, a beautiful girl under a mystic spell, a hidden fortune, and all the other factors that go to make a successful puzzler.

"Mumbo-Jumbo" is three acts of hilarious nonsense, with the crime elements completely smothered in the farce of a college youth who has to masquerade as his best friend's wife, and two small-town Sheriffs who

can't solve the crime for battling over which has jurisdiction.

The central characters, those of two harum-scarum college youths, will be played by Reece Wilson and G. D. Ray; Louise Banks will portray a beautiful young woman under the strange spell of Dr. Omahandra, taken by Bobby Anglin; Martha Pittman will be a Voodoo witch doctor; Andy Hilemon, a mysterious blind man; Juanita Holcomb will be Tweetie, a country lass; Ralph Metcalf will be the Sheriff of Milburn and Mabel Banks will be his female rival, the Sheriff of Hopetown. Others in the cast include: Juanita Banks Lawrence Styles, Billie Ray Bailey, Edd England, Tessie Griffith, Joyce Ray, and Mary Joe Young.

According to Miss Tomberlin, who is in charge of the production, "Mumbo-Jumbo" will be presented at Bald Creek High School on December 16. It is being produced by special arrangement with Samuel French of New York.

DRIVER'S LICENSE

All drivers with last names beginning with either E, F, or G, are required to take an examination for a driver's license by December 31, as a part of the Highway Safety Act passed by the 1947 General Assembly. The Department reported that this group of drivers had been very slow to report, and that if they procrastinated much longer it would mean they would have to wait in long lines to take their tests during the last few days of December.

Department officials also announced that the 100 examining station located throughout the State would be closed several days around Christmas, and that motorists who put off their tests might find it impossible to get them later.

There will be no extension to the deadline, the Department said, for E, F, and G motorists have had since last July to get these examinations.

Beginning January 1, 1949, persons with last names beginning with H, I, J, and K will begin taking their tests.

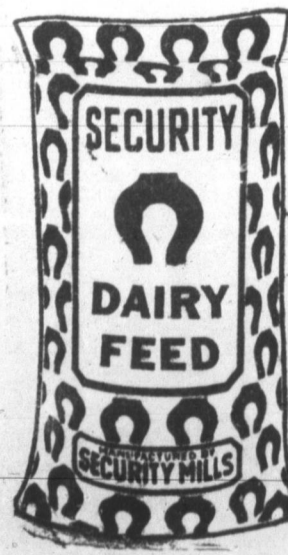

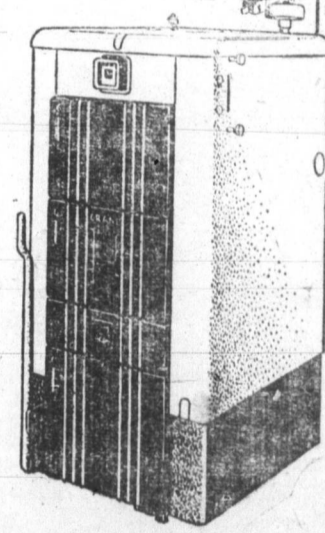
