HEALTH DEPARTMENT

James N. Fulp, assistant sanitarian of the Avery-Mitchell - Yancey District Health Department, has just completed an orientation course in the Cumberland County Health Department. Beginning April 1st, he will take over the duties of sanitarian for

Avery county, working out of the Newland office of the District Health Department. Jake F. Buckner, Senior Sanitarian, will continue to work in Mitchell and Yancey counties.

A film on care of the teeth, entitled "It's Your Health", was shown recently in all the high schools of the county. This film was borrowed by the district health department from the Film Library of the State Board of Health, and was shown in the schools by Iliff Clevenger, manager of the Yancey Theater.

Dog owners of the county were given additional warning last week by an incident that occurred in Columbia, S. C. There a mad dog got into a grammar school play yard during a recess hour and bit six pupils, a teacher and the school janitor.

The story was reported after the State Board of Health said the dog had rabies.

Police were summoned and chased the dog home. On the way he bit several other dogs and his owner who was helping police capture and kill the animal. This is an extreme case, but there are so many stray dogs in Yancey county, and others whose owners have failed to have vaccinated that a very real danger exists.

During the recent vaccination campaign hundreds of dogs were immunized against rabies but many more were not. Owners are

Cherokee Drama Opens July 1 in Great Smokies

Cherokee, N. C.—Visitors to the Great Smoky Mountains National Park will have the opportunity to see the drama of the Cherokees — presented by the Cherokee Indians themselves in an outdoor mountainside theatre five nights each week beginning July 1.

A full-blooded Cherokee, Frederick Kilpatrick, music professor of Southern Methodist University and composer of National Broadcasting Symphony's "Cherokee Suite" is writing original music for the two-act, 17-scene, 100-cast spectacle. The play is by Kermit Hunter, University of North Carolina Drama Department graduate; UNC's Carolina Playmaker Harry E. Davis, assistant to Sam Selden (The Lost Colony director and Drama Dept. head), will direct.

"Unto These Hills", a Drama of the Cherokees, has as central theme the Great Removal of Indians to Oklahoma in President Jackson's administration, the heroic stature of Junaluska and Sequoy (inventor of the first Indian alphabet), and the high drama of Old Tsal and his sons who voluntarily surrendered to death by firing squad to allow a pitiful remnant of brother braves to remain at peace in their beloved Smoky homeland. These dance sequences are included in the score.

Mountainside Theatre was hewn from the sides of Saunook Mountain above Cherokee Fairgrounds beside NC 107, the Clingman's Dome road between Cherokee and Gatlinburg, Tenn. Timber-topped stone masonry seats will now accommodate 2,000 spectators.
