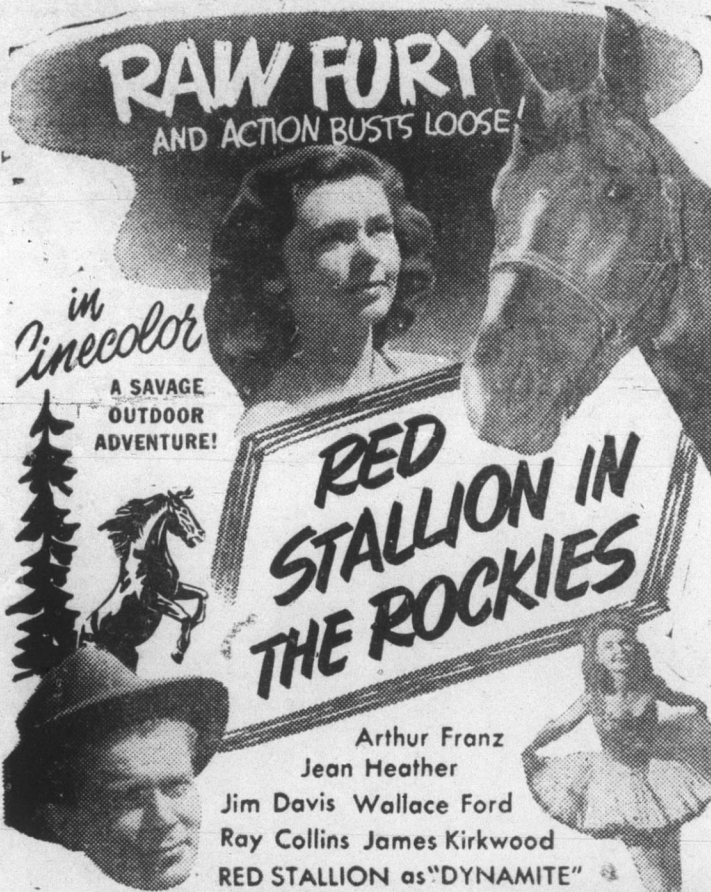

### More about — TOWN SQUARE

Square because of its elevation but mud made the roads leading into town and to the court house doors practically impassable during the winter months and the rainy season during Dog Days.

The Square has heard great oratory—when the statue to Otway Burns was dedicated with a Justice of the Supreme Court as speaker and on many other occasions.

Political rallies, farewells to those who marched away to four wars, and to those who returned, ice cream suppers when that was the fad—many gatherings, of many kind have been held on the Square.

The original court house and jail were torn down in 1907, and the present structures built in 1908. The Square then assumed its park-like atmosphere.

When paving the highway through Burnsville was proposed one plan suggested that it cut straight through instead of going around the Square. This was vigorously opposed. After all, Burnsville wouldn't be Burnsville without the Square!

Sealed proposals will be received by the Board of Education of Yancey County, at the County Courthouse, Burnsville, N. C. until 11:00 o'clock A. M. E. S. T., on the date specified in the specifications and immediately thereafter publicly opened and read, in the Court Room of the Yancey County Courthouse, Burnsville, N. C., for the furnishing of labor, materials and equipment entering into the construction of the South Toe River School Building and appurtenances thereto. Proposals received after the hour and date specified will not be considered.

Separate bids will be received for the General Contract and the Electrical Contract, for the Heating Contract and for the Plumbing Contract.

Complete plans, specifications and contract documents will be available for inspection in the Office of the Architect, Lindsey M. Gudger, 52 Carter Street, Asheville, N. C. after April 19th. Plans, specifications, and other contract documents may be obtained by prime contractors upon deposit of \$50.00 in cash or check, for General Contract; \$50.00 in cash or check for mechanical Contracts. The full deposit will be returned to contractors submitting bona fide proposals, provided plans and specifications are returned to the Architect in good condition within ten days after the date set for receiving of bids. Subcontractors' deposits will be refunded less cost of printing and handling. Such plans and specifications may be obtained on or after date mentioned in the specifications.

All Contractors are hereby notified that they must have proper license under the State laws governing their respective trades.

Each proposal shall be accompanied by a cash deposit, or by a certified check drawn on and certified by some bank or trust company authorized to do business in North Carolina in an amount equal to not less than 5% of the proposal; or in lieu thereof a bidder may offer a Certified Check as above of 2% of the bids plus a bid bond of 3% of the bid; said deposit to be retained by the Owner as liquidated damages in event of failure of the successful bidder to execute the contract within ten days after the award, or to give satisfactory surety as required by law. (Public Laws 1933, Section 1, Chapter 400, General Statutes of North Carolina, 1943, C 143 Art. 8 S.129)

Performance Bond will be required in amount of one hundred per cent (100%) of the contract price.  
Payment will be made on the basis of ninety per cent (90%) of monthly estimates and final payment made upon completion and acceptance of the work.

### MR. SMITH IS GOING TO WASHINGTON
