We are now in the process of bringing our books into balance for Fiscal year 1950 and preparing for Fiscal year 1951.

Being the kind who would rather be out in the woods scaling logs and marking timber than sitting in the office beating on a typewriter, we are most happy to have Miss Louise Huffman, a graduate of Crossnore Business College here in the office to help us out with the deluge of paper work that comes

at the close of a fiscal year. Miss Huffman, who hails from Hamrick, in Yancey County, is as pretty as she is efficient.

There is an increasing demand for national forest timber in the Mt. Mitchell District. However, before we can sell a boundary of timber every tree that is to be cut must be carefully measured and marked with yellow paint.

Jack C. Winchester, district service officer of the N. C. Veterans Commission will be in the court house here on Thursday, June 22 from 11 a. m. to 4 p. m.

Mr. Winchester stated that there is non service connected disability benefit payable to veterans of World War I and II, who have disabilities that prevent them from following a substantially gainful occupation, due to those disabilities.

After the veteran has reached age 55 the requirements are decreased. Requirements are 60% disabled for those between ages 55 and 60; 50% between ages 60 and 65, and only 10% requirement after reaching age 65.

Unemployability is also a factor in making determination as to entitlement. If you believe you qualify, contact your Veterans Service Officer and have claim filed.
