Four Cherokee boys and girls from the Qualla Boundary at Cherokee visited Yancey, Mitchell and Avery Counties on Wednesday and Thursday, June 28 and 29.

The Indian young people gave story-telling programs to groups at Burnsville Baptist Church, Moody's Home Camp at Celso, Bakersville Court House and Grandfather Home in Banner Elk.

The oldest was Jo Ann Catolster, a 7th grader and a full-blood Cherokee. The

youngest was Lloyd Arneach, a first grader who is mostly Cherokee with a little Catawba blood. Vivian Burgess, a 4th grader, and Jackie Saunooke, who is part Cherokee with a trace of Shawnee, made up the group. They were escorted by Miss Mary Ulmer Librarian of the Cherokee Indian School.

"Sands of Iwo Jima," Republic's remarkable story of the Marines' greatest hour, which will be shown at the Yancey Theatre, Sunday and Monday, will rank as one of the really great war pictures of the age.

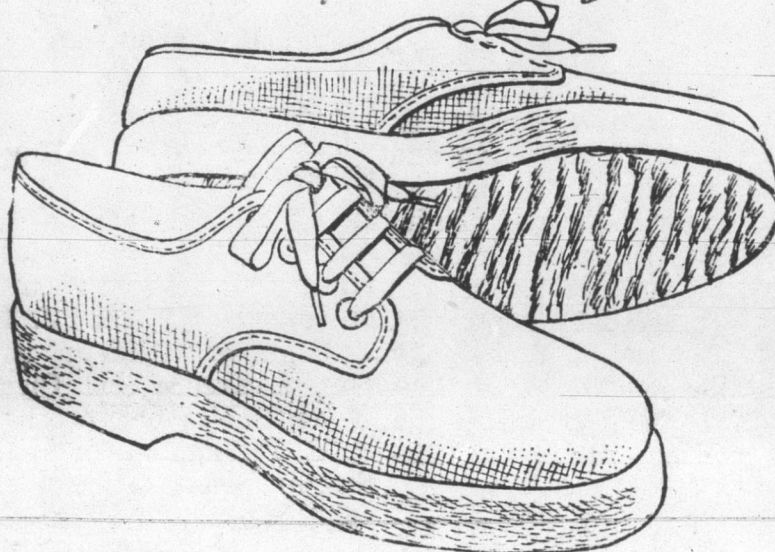

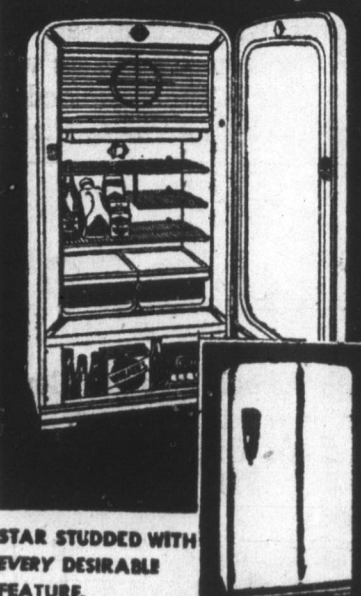
