The N. C. Veterans Commission, will have Jack C. Winchester, District Service Officer, in the County Courthouse, with the County Service Officer, Burnsville, on Thursday, July 27 from 11 a. m. to 4 p. m.

Mr. Winchester stated that the deadline for making application for unused terminal leave for World War II veterans has been extended. He stated that the veterans who were discharged from service prior to September 1, 1946, and have not applied for the pay, have until June 30, 1951 to make application.

Mr. Winchester, also stated that World War II veterans who have not received their Special Dividend check from the Service Insurance, or have not been informed that they are not eligible for the dividend, should now apply, to the Veterans Administration, Central Office, Washington 25, D. C., by letter to attention Special NSLI Dividend

"Pride of the Yanks" at Yancey Next Week

Lou Gehrig's vividly romantic career mirrored in "The Pride of the Yankees" coming to the Yancey next Wednesday and Thursday.

One of the great American stories comes to the screen again in "The Pride of the Yankees." It is the Samuel Goldwyn production of the chronicle of the boy from the tenements, son of emigrants, who rose to fame beyond his dreams.

Lou Gehrig, baseball's immortal hero, is played by Gary Cooper; Teresa Wright is seen as Eleanor whose love he won, and who lived through the strange events that ended his great, brilliant career.

All the sports world knew Gehrig, holder of more than a score of diamond records. Comparatively few, however, knew Gehrig the man, his struggling boyhood, his college career, his marriage, his personal life. It is this personal phase that forms the basis of the drama which culminates with the picture's memorable climax. This is the "Lou Gehrig Day, July 4, 1939, when fans packed the Yankee Stadium to render a farewell tribute to their idol.

"The Pride of the Yankees" features in a prominent role the late Babe Ruth, heading a group of Yankee stars who play themselves. They include Bill Dickey, Gehrig's closest friend; Bob Meusel, and Mark Koenig.

Actual scenes of the Yankee Stadium are incorporated in the film.
