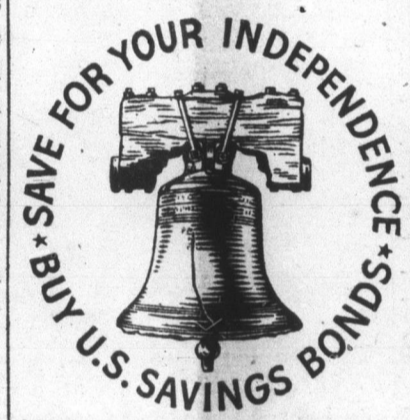

Ten per cent of the eggs and poultry products now being consumed in North Carolina are still being shipped in from other states.

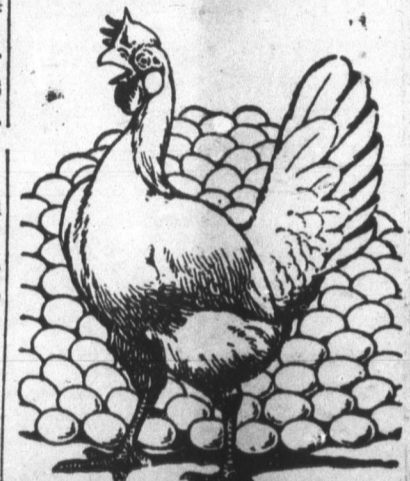

GOOD ROADS

Why should we delay any longer in building roads? Every law of economy and good business argues for the immediate construction of roads. But what are the arguments against road building? The same old question of taxing the future generation.

Let us consider briefly whether there is any real argument in favor of road building. In the first place, we are paying annually at least two and one-half per cent more for goods purchased from merchants than we should have to pay if the roads were good. Necessarily they must charge this heavy haul bill up to us. The following figures are based on the estimate of some of the best business men of the county. At the very lowest estimate our merchants sell \$200,000 worth of goods each year. The extra charges, due to poor roads would be \$5000 annually at two and one-half per cent. One leading merchant informed me, some time since that this 'mud tax' would be no less than five per cent. But I have taken the lowest estimate given that I may be on safe ground.

The Powers of Thought
