AROUND THE DISTRICT

Spruce and fir are traditionally cold-climate northern trees. There are few places in the South where they grow into commercial Christmas tree size. One of these places is on National Forest lands on Roan Mountain. Here, the fragrant evergreens grow in great abundance. If they are allowed to get too big they eventually spread out so much that they crowd each other, becoming poorly formed and scraggly. This week we are going up on the Roan to select and tag the trees that should be cut for Christmas trees. The tagged trees will be sold to wholesale buyers in units of 250 to 750 trees. Each unit of trees will be appraised—the appraised value being the minimum price acceptable to the government. Appraisal is based on the quality of the trees and how hard they are to get out. On a specified day in the middle of October, we will meet with all interested wholesale Christmas tree buyers on the Roan and show them the sale units. Where only one customer is interested in a unit

of trees, we will sell the tree-unit to him at the appraised price. If two or more purchasers want the same unit then we will auction off the unit to the highest bidder. Because of the saving in shipping costs, Roan Mt. Christmas tree buyers ought to be able to out sell Christmas tree dealers who ship their trees in from the Northern states.

On Friday, October 6th, National Forest Fire Wardens from Yancey, Mitchell and McDowell counties will meet with us at the Guard Station at Busick, for the District's Annual Forest Fire Training School. A full day of training and a barbecue is scheduled. We are expecting representatives of the North Carolina State Forest Service, the National Park Service, N. C. Wildlife Resources Commission and U. S. Forest Service representatives from the Atlanta Regional Office and the Supervisors Office to sit in on the National Forest Fire Wardens meeting. Exhibits, demonstrations and a quiz are among the events planned for the day.
