Orange and Semi-Sweet Chocolate

Make Novel Flavor Combination



Sift flour with baking powder and calt. Grean shortening, add and orange rind. Add Sour elter nets with croage tubes, mixing well, ending with flow. Then better into well greased pan (10"x15"x34"). Bake in a moderate crea (250"F.) 30 minutes. Cut ake into squares, ton with size of its reason and saves with shore and a squares, top with alice of ite cream, and serve with ebocolate sauce, or frost cake with chocolate frosting. If desired, top with whole or chopped nots. YIELD: 24 sources.

(Frosting or Sance)	
1 package semi-sweet chocolate 2 tablespoous butter or margarine 1 cup mittai confectioners' sugar	3 to 4 tablespoons hot milk, for frosting 3/2 cup hot milk, for sauce 1 teaspoon vanilla

In top of double boiler put semi-aweet chocolate and butter. Heat until melted and mix antil smooth. Remove from heat. For frosting add milk and sugar alternately, adding onough milk to make a spread able consistency. Stir in vanilla. For sauce, increase milk to be cup. VIELD: Frosting for top of 10x15 inch cake, or 11/2 cups chocolate
