"EASY DOES IT"

DO YOUR CLEANING easily and in comfort if you want to avoid accidents as well as muscle strain. A dress that's comfortable, or a pair of slacks and shirt are a good outfit for cleaning, especially when you can move freely, with shoulder room. Long housecoats are out, for you might slip on them. Take time out to get a stepladder when you're cleaning windows or shelves, instead of using a rickety chair. When you're lifting or carrying, plant the feet firmly on the floor and bend the knees to do any picking up. Straighten the knees gradually to prevent lifting entirely with the back. When you're removing magazines, papers and other items, do carry a basket so that one trip will do several. Use a basket, also, for cleaning supplies.

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Peaches in Orange Sauce
(Serves 6-8)

- 1 No. 2 1/2 can peach halves or slices
- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons cornstarch
- Dash of salt
- 1/2 cup orange juice
- 3 whole cloves
- 3 whole allspice

Drain peaches; reserve juice and measure 1/2 cup. Combine sugar, cornstarch and salt in saucepan. Stir in 1/2 cup peach juice and orange juice. Add spices. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Add peaches and simmer 5 minutes. Cool. Serve with plain or whipped cream, or use as a pudding sauce.

Small wagons are ideal for carrying out many items such as several waste baskets. In this way you can make one wagon trip to save several others, and also avoid lifting.

Plan your work so that something can be started, while you do other tasks. For example, let the shower curtain soak in the bath tub while you clean the medicine chest, bowl or change towels.

Another example for cleaning routine is to strip your bed and let it air while you wash woodwork. Just blinds or pick up the room and dust. After this is done, finish the bed.

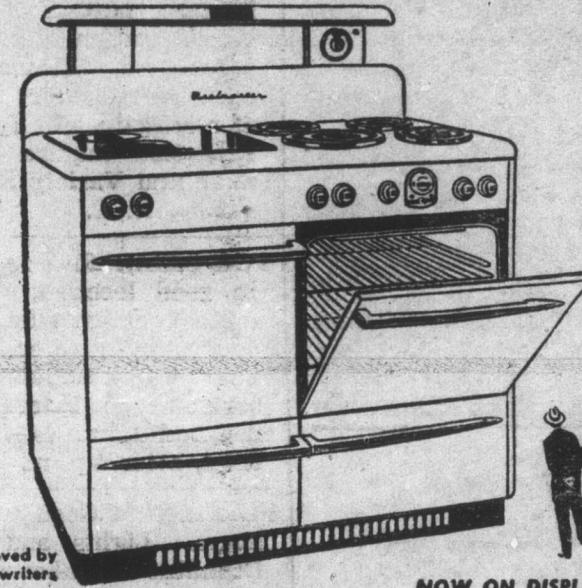
