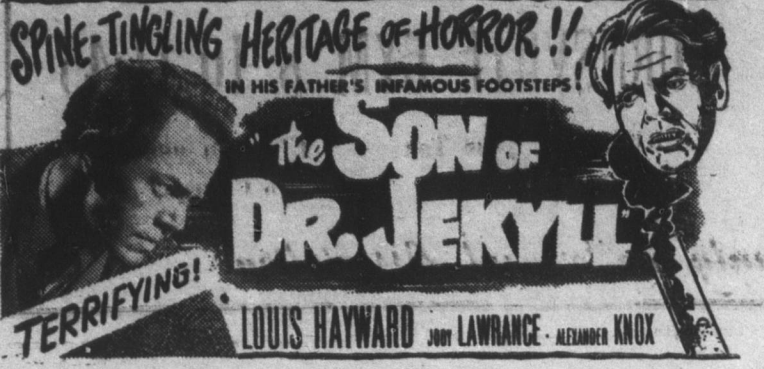

The Board of Education of Yancey County, being of the opinion that the Locust Creek Schoolhouse and site upon which it is located in South Toe Township, Yancey County, North Carolina, has become unnecessary for public school purposes, signed an order at a special meeting on the 26th day of May, 1952 directing the sale of the Locust Creek Schoolhouse and site upon which it is located:

Therefore, by virtue of said order and the power invested in the Board of Education by the laws of the State of North Carolina, The Board of Education of Yancey County will offer for sale at public auction to the highest bidder for cash at 11:00 o'clock a. m. on the 26th day of June, 1952 at the courthouse door in Burnsville, North Carolina, the following described property:

FIRST TRACT: BEGINNING on a spruce pine known as Potter's corner and runs an easterly course with D. N. Robinson's line 45 feet to the public road; thence a north-easterly course with public road 11 poles to a planted stone on the west side of the public road; thence a westerly course 120 feet to a planted stone; thence a southerly course 11 poles to a planted stone; thence an easterly course 75 feet to the BEGINNING, such right-of-way over said lands to the public highway as D. ADVERTISEMENT FOR PROPOSALS

Sealed proposals will be received by the Board of Education of Yancey County in the office of the County Superintendent of Schools in the Yancey County Courthouse, Burnsville, N. C., until 2:00 P. M. Monday, June 23, 1952 for furnishing all materials, labor, tools, equipment and appliances for the construction of a new consolidated High School Building at Burnsville, N. C., at which time and place they will be publicly opened and read.

Separate proposals will be received for general contract, heating and accessories, plumbing and accessories, and electrical installations.

Plans, specifications and contract documents are open to public inspection at the office of Frank W. Howell, County Superintendent of Schools, Burnsville, N. C., or may be obtained from V. W. Breeze & Associates, Architects and Engineers, Shelby, N. C., at any time before the opening of the proposals, upon deposit of \$25.00. The full amount of the deposit for one set of documents will be returned to each actual bidder submitting a bona fide bid, upon return of all documents in good condition within 5 days after the date of opening of proposals.

Each proposal must be accompanied by a deposit with the Board of cash or a certified check, payable to the Board, on some bank or trust company insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation in an amount equal to not less than 5 percent of the proposal. In lieu of making the cash deposit as above provided, such bidder may file a bid bond executed by a corporate surety licensed under the laws of North Carolina to execute such bonds, conditioned that the surety will, upon demand, forthwith make payment to the obligee upon said bond if the bidder fails to execute the contract in accordance with the bid bond and upon failure to forthwith make payment, the surety shall pay to the obligee an amount equal to double the amount of said bid bond. This deposit shall be retained if the successful bidder fails to execute the contract within 10 days after the award or fails to give satisfactory surety as required by law. The deposit will be returned to the unsuccessful bidders and to the successful bidder upon execution of the contract and performance bond.

The Board shall require the person to whom the award of any contract is made to furnish bond in some surety company authorized to do business in the State, or require a deposit of money, certified check or government securities for the full amount of said contract for the faithful performance of the terms of said contract.

No proposal may be withdrawn for a period of 15 days after receipt of proposals.

General contractors are notified that "An Act to Regulate the Practice of General Contracting", ratified by the General Assembly of North Carolina on March 10, 1925 and as subsequently amended, (Public Laws of 1937, ratified March 23rd, Public Laws of 1949, ratified May 23rd), will be observed in receiving and awarding the General contract.

Plumbing and Heating contractors are notified that Public Local Laws of 1931, Chapter 52, and as subsequently amended by Public Laws of 1933, Chapter 57, will be observed in receiving and awarding Plumbing and Heating contracts.

Electrical contractors are notified that provisions of Chapter 87, Public Laws of 1937, ratified March 23rd will be observed in receiving proposals and awarding electrical contracts.

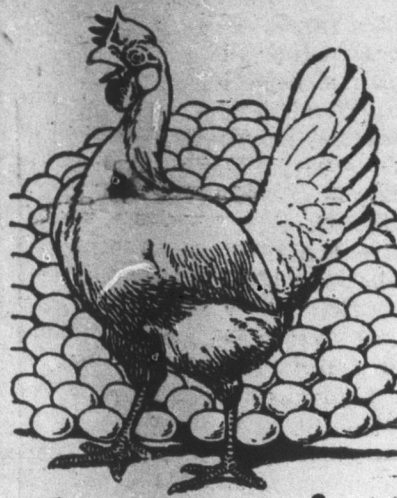
Awards will be made to the lowest responsible bidders provided it is to the Board's interest to accept such proposals. Deductible alternates, if contained in the proposal, will be used at the Board's option. The Board reserves the right to reject any or all proposals and to waive informalities.

The procedure followed in receiving proposals and awarding contracts shall be in accordance with Article 8, Chapter 143, of the General Statutes of North Carolina.
