

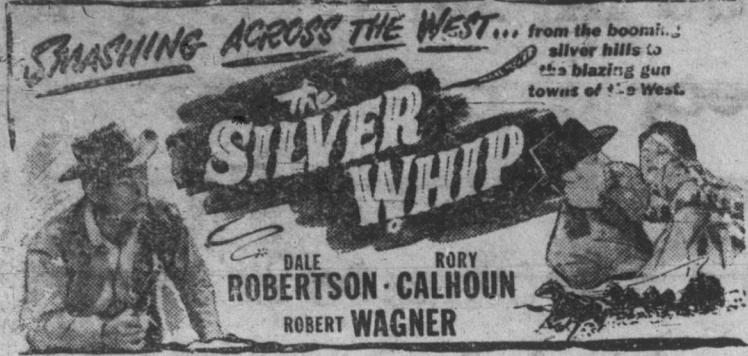

ments, merchandise—may be open the third and fourth class should carry the inscription "Continued for postal inspection."

In addition to the usual articles normally prohibited in the mails, matches of all kinds and lighter fluid may not be mailed to overseas military addresses. Coffee, cigarettes, and other tobacco product are prohibited in parcels addressed to some A. P. O.'s and navy post offices. Consult your postmaster before packing articles of this nature. Addresses must be legible and prepared in typewriting or ink. It is preferable that the outside addresses be hand printed directly on the wrapper of the boxes rather than on labels pasted to the wrappers. It is highly desirable that a slip of paper containing the names and addresses of the sender and addressee, together with a list of the contents be enclosed in each parcel, stated Mr. Hensley.

"Merry-Christmas", "Please do not open until Christmas", "With best wishes, and similar greetings and instructions may be placed on the covering of the parcel in such a manner as not to interfere with the address. Greeting cards for overseas armed forces may be mailed at any time but they should be prepaid at first class rate and mailed before November 15. Airmail should be mailed before December first.

Duke Prizes in South Carolina, Feb. 15, 1954; Duke University National Scholarships for Women, March 1, 1954; Duke University Regional Scholarships in Virginia, Maryland, District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Tennessee and West Virginia, Feb. 15, 1954.

ce alone may be qualifying for some positions. Candidates for the Junior Management Assistant examination who meet the requirements will be given an oral interview. The age limits, waived for persons entitled to veteran preference, are 18 to 35 years (except for the position of Agricultural Writer-Editor for which there is no maximum age limit). Further information and application forms, including the addresses of the places where applications must be sent, are available at many post offices throughout the country, and at the United States Civil Service Commission, Washington 25, D. C. For the Junior Management Assistant examination, applications must be filed not later than November 12, 1953; for the Junior Agricultural Assistant examination, not later than December 1, 1953.

Aside from the advantage to veterans, it is estimated that the new procedure will save around \$600,000 per year in the costs of administering the GI insurance operations.

Once the automatic renewal is effected, VA said, the veteran has a new 5-year term policy on which he must pay the increased premiums on time if he wishes to be covered against death. If he misses any premium payments, including the first renewal premium, he may reinstate the policy at any time before the end of the term period under the usual reinstatement procedures. When a term policy is renewed, the holder has a higher premium rate to pay than on the original policy, since the premium is based on the age of the holder at the time the renewed policy becomes effective.
