ce alone may be qualifying for some positions. Candidates for the Junior Management Assist_ ant examination who meet the requirements will be given an oral interview. The age limits. waived for persons entitled to veteran preference, are 18 to 35 years (except for the position of Agricultural Writer-Editor for which there is no maximum age limit).

Further information and ap plication forms, including the addresses of the places where applications must be sent, are available at many post offices throughout the country, and at the United States Civil Service Commission, Washington 25, D. C. For the Junior Management Assistant examination, applications must be filed not later than November 12, 1953; for the Junior Agricultural Assistant examination, not later than December 1, 1953.
