WHEREAS, there is a large amount of Water Bonds. outstanding which were issued by the Town of Burnsville, North Carolina, and which will mature in 1965 and the payment of which the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Burnsville hopes to meet without increasing the Town tax rate:

- 1. That beginning with the month of July, 1955, the flat rate for each water connection or account shall






