



RECIPE OF THE WEEK Mince Meat Sauce (Makes 1½ cups)

¼ cup sugar 11/2 tablespoons cornstarch 34 cup boiling water

1 tablespoon lemon juice 1/8 teaspoon' salt 1 9-ounce package condensed mince meat

1 cup cold water ' Blend sugar and cornstarch Stir in boiling water. Cook slowly, stirring constantly until thickened and clear. Remove from heat; add lemon juice, salt and prepared mince meat. To prepare mince meat, break it into small pieces in a sauce pan, and cold water and stir to break lumps. Bring to a boil and boil rapidly for two minutes. Serve sauce hot or cold on gingerbread, spice cake or squares of yellow or white cake


