He plans to do graduate work on his Masters degree at the University of N. C. this fall.

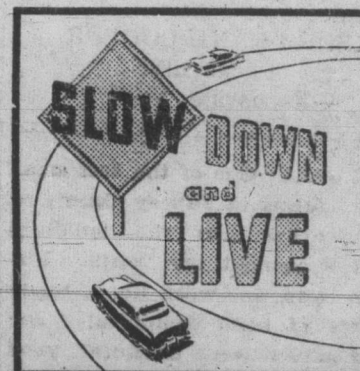
