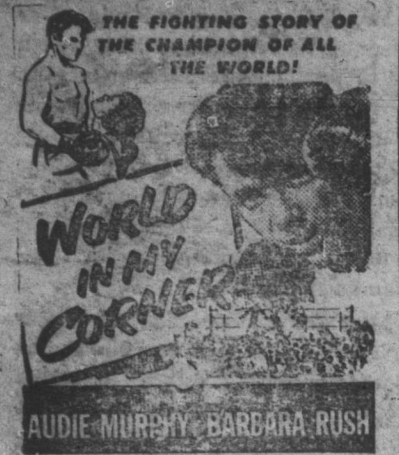

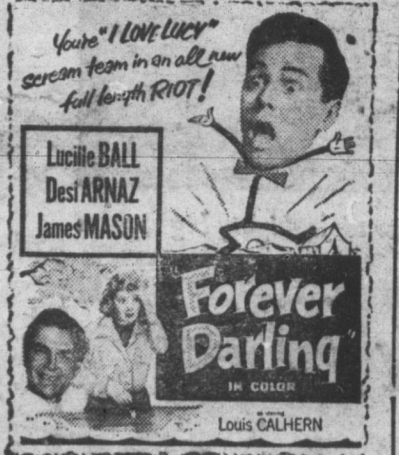

Two students from the Burnsville area were awarded Associate in Arts diplomas, and one received a one-year business certificate, Monday morning, June 4, at Mars Hill College's 100th graduation exercises which climaxed its centennial celebration.

Dr. Frank Porter Graham, a mediator for the United Nations, delivered the commencement address. Dr. Graham is a former U. S. senator and also former president of the University of North Carolina.

Associate in Arts diplomas were awarded to 234 graduates including Miss Vernell Harris, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Joe Harris of Burnsville, and Lloyd Richard Bailey, son of Mr. Glen Bailey of Burnsville, RFD 1. Mrs. Mary Anne Gibbs, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Thomas H. York of Burnsville received a one-year business certificate.

Following the annual alumni banquet Saturday night, a historical pageant "Let There Be Light" was staged in the college amphitheatre, depicting significant events in the founding and growth of the college. More than two years have been spent in research and planning for the production.

Dr. R. Paul Caudill, a graduate of Mars Hill and now prominent minister of Memphis, Tenn., delivered the baccalaureate sermon Sunday morning.

The Mars Hill College choir, band and women's glee club provided music for the various programs during the commencement season.

The 48th annual Farm and Home Week is being observed at State College, Raleigh, this week. The Federation of Home Demonstration Clubs will hold its annual meeting today (Thursday) at which time Mrs. Ralph Proffitt of Yancey County will be installed as State president of the Federation. Following the meeting, the women will attend a tour at the Governor's Mansion.

According to Miss Sue Nottingham, home agent, classes are being offered in various fields for those who attend; and exhibits of the latest in farm and home equipment, similar to those at the State fair, are being displayed.

The program for men this year offers practical training in eleven farm enterprises and subjects, adapted to conditions of the different farming areas of the State. They will attend lectures and demonstrations designed for their individual areas.
