

Learning To Drive Is Lifetime Job

RALEIGH — "Learning how to drive is not a five-lesson proposition—it's a lifetime job!"

Those words composed Major W. B. Lentz's message to Tar Heel motorists this week as he spoke in connection with the Motor Vehicles Department's vacation safe driving program. Major Lentz is the State Highway Patrol executive in charge of communications and transportation.

Major Lentz pointed out that the past decade has seen marked strides forward in automobile design and production, with the result that modern automobiles are faster and more powerful—and more numerous—than ever before.

"But the increased speed, power and traffic density require more control and greater skill in driving," the major said.

Urging all motorists to keep up to date in their driving habits, Major Lentz said that many drivers on our highways today are still using driving techniques as obsolete as the out-dated model car in which they first learned to drive.

"A motorist has to be alert to rapid developments in our highway system, too, especially with so many new highways, bridges, and intersections springing up over North Carolina," Major Lentz said.

"These smooth, ribbon-like roads cutting across mountain and valley from one end of the state to the other are beautiful to drive on, but driving a modern high-powered car on them requires control, precision and highly developed driving skills," Major Lentz said.

Pointing out that the comfort and ease of driving today has a dangerous tendency to dull the alertness of the driver to the increased dangers of modern traffic, Major Lentz cautioned all motorists, especially those on vacation trips, to drive safely and to keep alert at all times.

"A good motto for every motorist to heed," the major said, is "Slow Down and Live."

"I REMEMBER" BY THE OLD TIMERS

From J. B. Phinegal, Eshree, Pennsylvania: I remember in the years 1886 and 1887 when my father worked ten hours a day on an up and down saw mill which was operated by water power. Father received 65 cents per day and we lived on a mountainside in Pennsylvania.

My mother, with my baby sister and I would quite often take Father's lunch to him. We had a mile and a half walk on a mountain road to reach the main highway, a one-way road, as it is yet in this year 1956.

Flour at that time was burred ground, a 24-lb. sack was 45 cents. Bread made from this flour was dark brown in color. I often wish for a slice of Mother's bread and a piece of her pie, baked of some kind or dried fruit. Mother never did any canning, but dried all kinds of berries and many kinds of apples. She never canned cucumbers but always packed them in a salty brine and when ready to use soaked them in water until the salty taste was gone.

School opened the latter part of September and closed the latter part of March. Each child had to furnish his own books, slates and slate pencils. A year or two later, we got copy books and lead pencils. The teacher wrote all the copies in the copy books. My copy book was made of fools-cap paper which my parents had to buy for me.

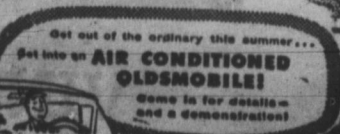
