WASHINGTON QUIZ

Q—Can you tell me how the record high cost of living index published recently affects farmers?
A—An analysis of the figures would seem to indicate that items the farmer buys from other industries were increased, and items he would buy from other farmers were down in price. Here are examples: As of July, 1956, Farm interest rate on debt was up 57%; building, and fencing, up 8%; Building materials up 6½%; Autos and supplies up 6%; Household supplies up 6%; clothing up 4½%; Taxes, per acre, up 29%; Household furnishings, down ½%; fertilizer down 4%; seed down 12½%; Feed, down 15%; livestock, down 34%; food and tobacco, no change.

Q—My father died in military service. I am eligible for training under the new education program for children of deceased veterans. May I take on-the-job training?
A—No. The law prohibits on-the-job training. It must be taken in the classroom.

Q—Was there a law passed in the 84th Congress which will permit veterans of World War II and post-Korean veterans to reinstate their lapsed 5-year term G.I. insurance?
A—Yes? Applying to those who failed to pay either or both of their last two monthly premiums. Veterans administration will notify you if you are eligible under the law. They are now checking their records.

Q—When is national transportation week?
A—October 22 to 28, 1956 will be observed as National Transportation week.

Q—Who coined the word "Americanize" and how was it first used?
A—John Jay, Governor of New York in 1797 in a letter to Col. John Trumbull, wrote "I wish to see our people more Americanized, if I may use that expression. Until we feel and act as an independent nation, we shall always suffer from foreign intrigue."
