N. C. Doctor Calls For Greater Attack On Polio

Chapel Hill — Dr. Samuel F. Ravenel of Greensboro, Chairman of the Polio Vaccination Committee of the State Medical Society, has emphasized that a three-pronged attack is necessary if paralytic polio is to be wiped out in North Carolina this year.

In a special bulletin to all county medical societies, Dr. Ravenel outlined the attack as (1) enthusiastic pushing of polio vaccination for every private patient by every private physician; (2) constant administration of vaccine in the established, free, public health clinics all over the state; and (3) in the areas which did not undertake such a program last summer an initial, intensive, mass, free, public immunization campaign would be extremely helpful.

This campaign would be implemented by the county medical society and would utilize all the resources of state, county and city health departments, and every available local aid, he said.

"Any program of immunization which utilizes only the private physician, will, I fear, fail to protect enough of the population," Dr. Ravenel said.

The American Medical Association, the North Carolina State Medical Society and the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis have combined forces to promote the vaccination of every one from three months to 40 years of age with Salk vaccine by the end of June of this year.

"Vaccinate Before Too Late" is the national slogan of the big push to eradicate paralytic polio in 1957.

God Works Through Billy Graham



Billy Graham the dynamic evangelist whose amazing international ministry has been called "the phenomenon of the mid-twentieth century" has once again become the subject of a new and inspiring book.

Titled "Billy Graham," this latest literary account deals with the personal history of this amazing man, his message and his mission. An itemized account of the fabulous Billy Graham Evangelistic Association which, from tens of thousands of small contributions received last year, spent \$2,000,000 for Billy's radio, film and preaching ministry, is also described.

Such provocative questions as: What manner of man is this handsome young evangelist who has reaped this rich harvest of souls? Is he genuine? Do his conversions last? Is he merely a flash in the pan or is he really the religious phenomenon of our era, are candidly answered in the story of the North Carolinian, who world church leaders declare "walks at the side of God."

All of Billy Graham's diaries, records and personal letters were made available to Stanley High, who also did on-the-scene research in both America and abroad and followed in the wake of the Crusades, interviewing converts and ministers.

Heart-warming character sketches of the evangelist's lovely wife Ruth and amusing anecdotes about his four children in their hilltop home in Montreat, North Carolina, provide a wealth of human interest and show the basic simplicity of this most extraordinary of men.
