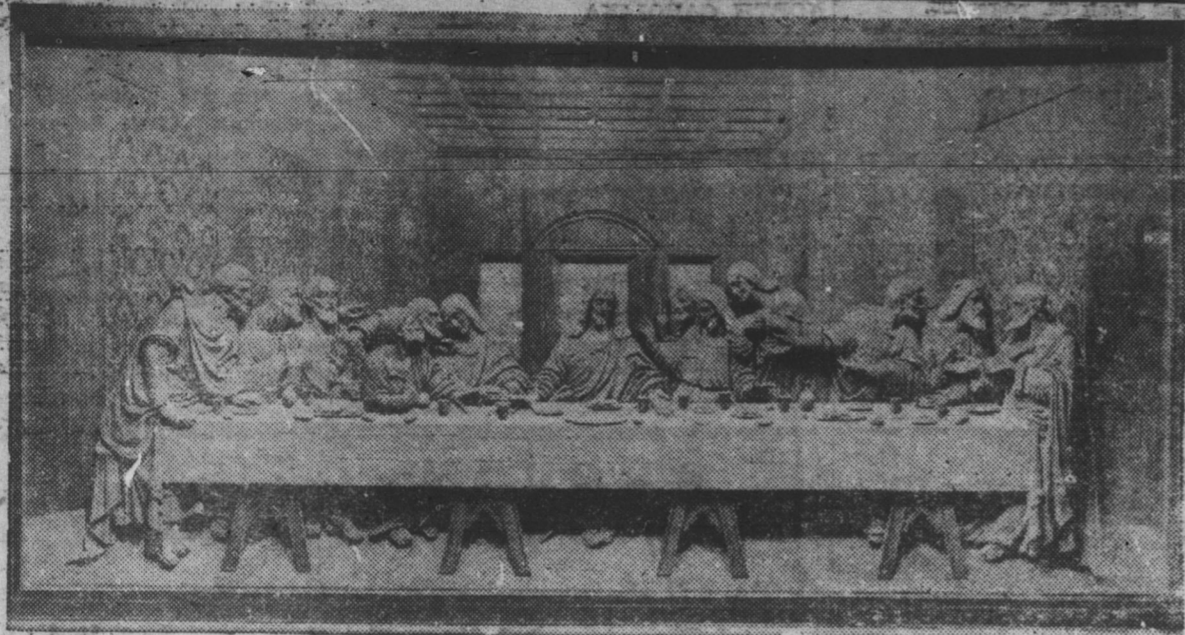


Local People Visit Upper Room Chapel



Nashville, Tenn., Dec. 30, 1957.—Mrs. Fred Wilson, Mrs. Herman Angel, Freida Hill and Mr. and Mrs. W. C. Angel, all of Burnsville, were among the nearly five thousand people who signed the guest register at The Upper Room Chapel this fall. The chapel, opened less than five years ago, draws visitors from every state and many other countries. The focal point of the chapel is the almost life-size wood carving of the Last Supper done by Ernest Pelligrini after the famous painting by Leonardo da Vinci. This carving captures the moment when Jesus tells his disciples, "One of you shall betray me." Set

in a huge frame of limewood and walnut, the carving is more than eighteen feet long. The artistry and skill of the sculptor are apparent to even the casual viewer. Many visitors see it with a deep spiritual sensitivity that makes the visit a religious experience. The wood carving is placed on the rear wall of the chancel. The chancel reproduces the scene depicted in the carving. Here are the same tapestried walls, the same beamed ceiling, the same inlaid floor, and most striking of all, the altar reproduces the great table about which the disciples are seated with their Master.

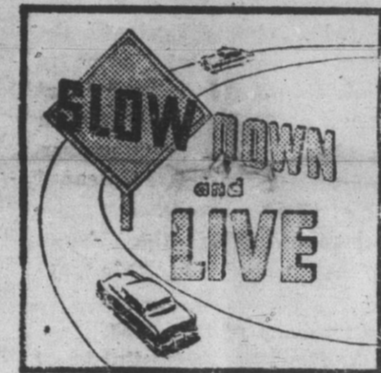
Other features of the chapel include a lovely prayer room, an interesting high pulpit, a chancel rail that carries the symbols of the disciples and an elaborately carved gate. Below the chapel are the museum and devotional library. The chapel is the central feature of the building which houses the offices and shipping rooms of THE UPPER ROOM, the world's most widely used devotional guide. It is published in 36 editions including 30 languages, Braille and Talking Book. More than ten million people, it is estimated, use this devotional guide daily.

THIS WEEK'S RECIPE
Walnut Cookies (Makes 4 dozen)
1/2 cup butter or substitute
1/2 cup sugar
1 egg
1/2 teaspoon vanilla
1 1/4 cups sifted flour
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cup chopped walnuts
Cream together butter and sugar. Add egg and vanilla, beating thoroughly. Sift together flour and salt and blend into creamed mixture. Stir in walnuts. Drop by teaspoons on greased baking sheet. Bake in a moderately hot (375°F.) oven about 10 minutes. Remove to wire rack to cool.

will save the foil plates in which come pastry, TV dinners and rolls. They wash readily and can be used for putting up the same kind of items when you're readying food for your own freezer. Overwashing is never good for clothes no matter what kind of machine is used. Prolonged washing action may actually redeposit soil on the clothes. Washing boots in the machine? If you don't have the latest appliance which swirls out the sediment, then rinse the boots before washing to remove dirt, sand and other foreign particles. Let oven cleaners stand on the porcelain enamel surface long enough to dry pretty thoroughly, then rinse them off. Crusted portions will come clean more easily.

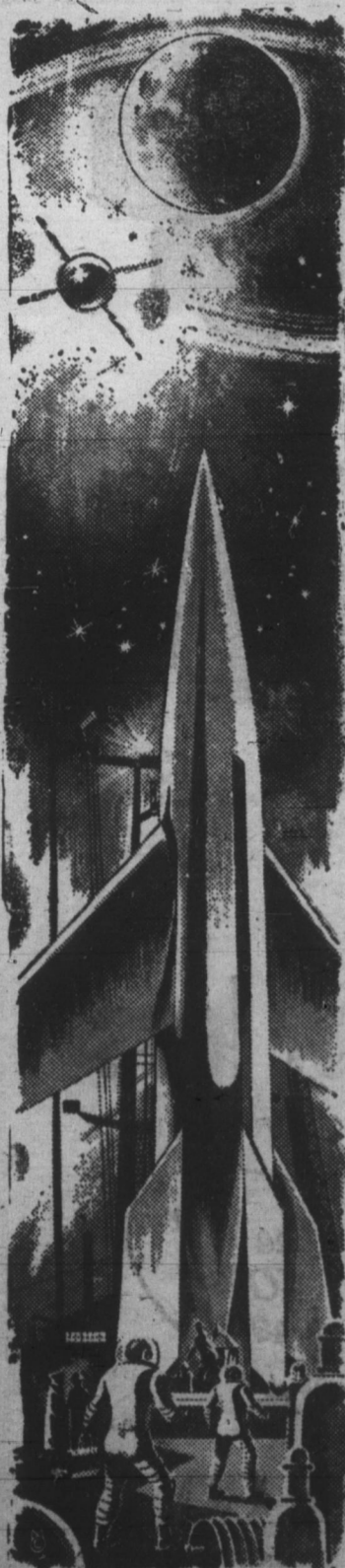

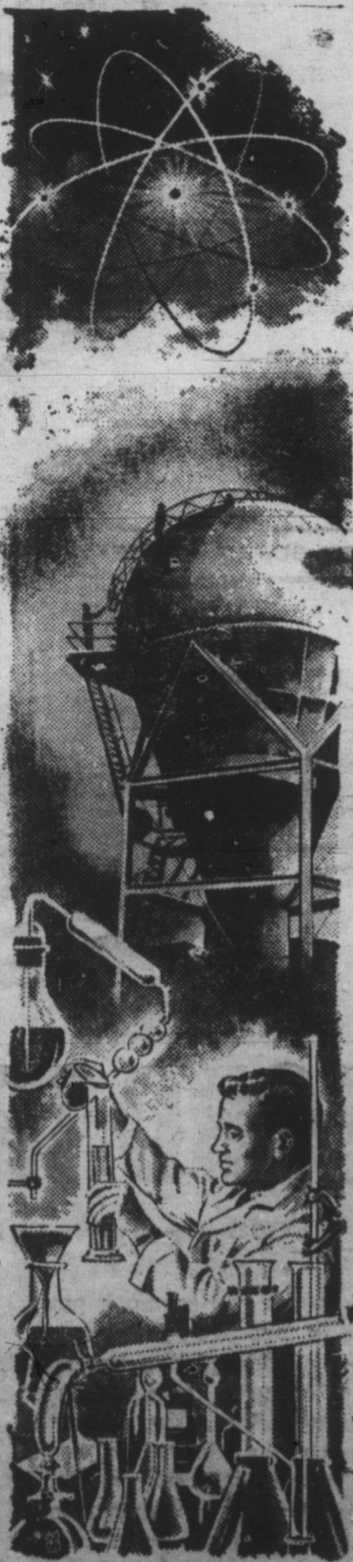

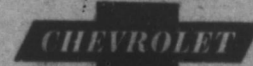
