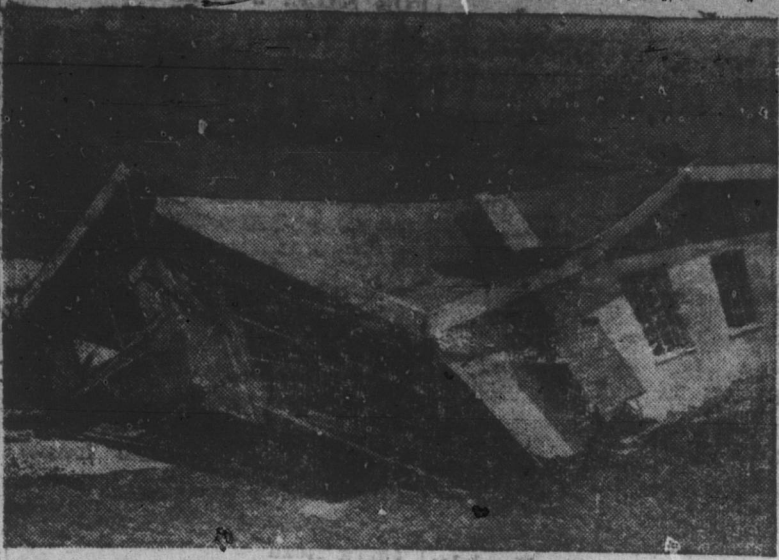

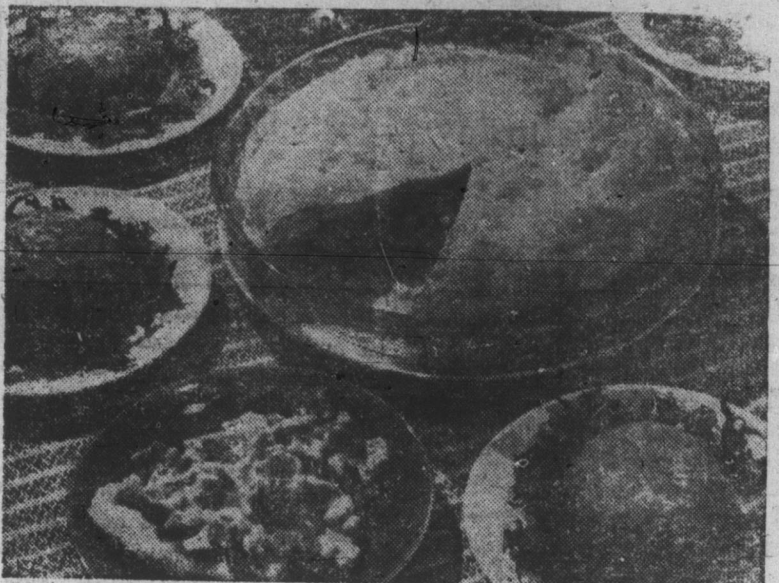
Mr. and Mrs. Paul Fedoruk of New Jersey visited Mr. and Mrs. James Neuhauser of Celso during the week.

Upside-Down Ham Pie

UPSIDE-DOWN HAM PIE

| 2 cups cubed, cooked ham | Dash pepper |
| 1 1/2 cups cooked baby lima beans | 1/2 cup milk |
| 1/4 teaspoon prepared horseradish | 1/2 cup dairy sour cream |
| 1 tablespoon chopped parsley | 1/4 cup shortening |
| 1/4 teaspoon salt | 1 1/2 cups sifted enriched self-rising flour |
| 2 tablespoons butter or margarine | 1 egg, beaten |
| 2 tablespoons enriched self-rising flour | 1/2 cup milk |
| 1/4 teaspoon salt | |

Combine ham, lima beans, horseradish, parsley and salt. Set aside. Melt butter or margarine in saucepan. Add flour, salt and pepper and blend well. Heat until bubbly. Add milk gradually, stirring constantly. Cook until thickened. Add sour cream, a tablespoon at a time, stirring constantly. Heat but do not boil. Stir sauce into ham mixture. Turn into buttered 9-inch pie pan. Cut shortening into flour until mixture is crumbly. Combine egg and milk. Add milk mixture to flour to make a soft dough. Turn out on lightly floured board or pastry cloth and knead gently 30 seconds. Roll out into a 9-inch circle. Fit over ham mixture. Cut slits in top to allow steam to escape. Bake in hot oven (425°F.) about 20 minutes. Serve hot. Cut into wedges and turn upside down on serving plates.

Service Officer To Be Here April 24th

The North Carolina Veterans Commission will have a Representative, Jack C. Winchester, with the County Service Officer, Court House, Burnsville, on Thursday, April 24, from 11:00 A. M. to 4:00 P. M.; and he will be with the County Service Officer, Court House, Bakersville, on Friday, April 25, from 8:30 A. M. to 2:30 P. M., to assist Veterans and their dependents.

Mr. Winchester states that all veterans holding government life insurance should keep Veterans Administration informed of any change they wish made in beneficiaries, as such change cannot be made by last will and testament. Veterans Administration must pay proceeds to beneficiary of record.

Family status changes such as marriages, divorces, births or deaths indicate needed changes in beneficiary listings.

Mr. Winchester or your County Service Officer has the necessary forms for changing beneficiaries and will be glad to assist in completing the forms.

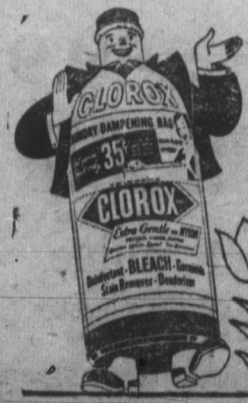
