ASC Office To Mail Tobacco Marketing Cards To Producers

Announcement has been made by the ASC office here that tobacco marketing cards are being prepared and will be mailed to all tobacco producers within five days of the opening of the market on November 24. According to ASC officials cards will not be passed out over the counter this year to conform with the latest regulation requirements. Farmers receiving cards should read instructions on the back of the card and see that all requirements are met, It is also emphasized that all cards are to be returned to the county office as soon as possible after the last sale is made, and in no event later than 30 days after the market
