Are you getting the benefits from your vegetable garden that you should? If we assume that a garden is desirable from the standpoint of economy and nutritional value, are you using recommended varieties, fertilizer and cultural practices? Let's see what a recent survey in a Western county reveals.

Seventy families were interviewed and asked questions about ten vegetables which are considered to be the most popular for home gardens. This is the story: Only 44 of the 70 families had vegetable gardens; Irish potatoes and tomatoes were the most popular vegetables grown; only a small percentage planted strawberries (25 per cent) and lima beans (5 per cent); most families did not use recommended varieties; the same was true for recommended fertilizers; other advised practices were not followed by a large number of families interviewed.

There is no way of telling how typical these results are when compared with other rural communities, but I suspect that this local situation is not unique if data were available from other areas.

To me this situation brings into sharp focus the wealth of information available to rural—and urban people, in the whole field of agricultural endeavor, and the puny use that is made of it. Have we reached the point where we only want to be helped and do nothing to help ourselves? Maybe so, but I am not ready to accept this.

Sweet potatoes need lots of potash and this is generally true for all of the root crops. Recent tests made on Norfolk loamy sand showed that yields per acre varied from fifty bushels on the no-potash plots to as high as three hundred and fifty on the high potash plots. In addition to the higher yields, the quality of the potatoes was better. These tests were conducted on low potash soils. The best way to determine total potash needs for sweet potatoes is to have your soil tested.
