Stay away from large trees for two reasons - they have excensive root systems which will compete with the vegetables for moisture, and they produce shade. Most vegetables like full sun.

Avoid soils which are poorly drained. If you have a new home, be on the look-out for mortar, brick, stumps and other debris that may have covered while establishing a final grade.

It is a good idea to plan your garden on paper. This will give an opportunity to locate all crops, arrange for succession plantings and assure a plentiful supply of vegetables for fresh use, freezing and canning.

Plant perennials along one side of the garden so they will be out of the way when you are working your annual crops. I'm speaking of such things as asparagus, rhubarb, strawberries, dewberries

If you receive \$150 cash wages ured on a time basis.

If you care \$150 or more in cash wages from one employer, you need not be concerned about the number of days you worked. These wages are covered by Social Secunity. If you carned less than \$150 the number of days worked is the fautdr in determining coverage for social security purposes. The emp player is responsible for withholding and paying your social security tax. The above situations prevail only in those cases where the farm worker is an employee of the farm the undersigned Administratrix at

Sharecroppers and teaant farmers are self-employed persons and are subject to the same provisions as any other self-employed farmer. Records of your farm income and expenses must be kept and timely tax returns must be filed each year.


