OUR TOWN

This week we have a few facts to present on paving and street maintenance.

But first, we must apologize to the faithful readers of "Our Town" who struggled through last week's column. The linotype machine simply had a bad day when that column was set up. The omission of "not" in one sentence started off the confusion, and a few lines further on the chaos was completed where "unfortunate" was printed as "fortunate." At this point, we imagine most readers gave up the attempt to inform themselves regarding sewage disposal.

The papers this past week have printed the news release of the State Highway Department announcing that Burnsville will shortly receive a check for \$7,365, distributed under the Powell Bill. This is money coming from the state gasoline tax, that must be used for paving and street maintenance.

have urged the desirability of further extending the town streets. Knowing that the allocation of Powell Bill funds is based in part on street mileage, they have suggested that it will pay the town to open up new streets. The facts are that added Powell Bill money we receive for any lengthening of our street system works out to only about eight cents per foot per year. This is only a small amount compared with the cost of grading, ditching, spreading gravel, installing drain tile, and maintaining new streets.

We are not, of course, arguing against all construction of new streets. But the point we are making is that justification of street extension must not be found in the prospect of further Powell Bill money, but in the useful purpose served by the new streets.

A few people have mistakenly given credit to the Town for the splendid black-top job on the main highway through town. We wish we deserved credit for its improvement, but to be quite honest, we don't deserve it. That job was contracted for, supervised, and paid for by the State Highway Department. It was not paid for by the town treasury.

Publication of this news has prompted a number of citizens to suggest to the mayor that this would be an opportune time for the town to spread a few loads of gravel on the street in front of their houses, or to make other street improvements. We hate to disappoint these good citizens eager for street improvement, but it is the unhappy fact that this Powell Bill money has already been spent. The major paving and street maintenance undertaken last June, used not only the Powell Bill money received last year, but anticipated the receipt of the forthcoming check from the State. Most of that check we must turn over to the paving company for work already done.
