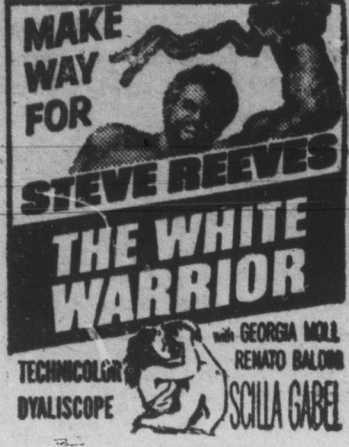

tional meeting.

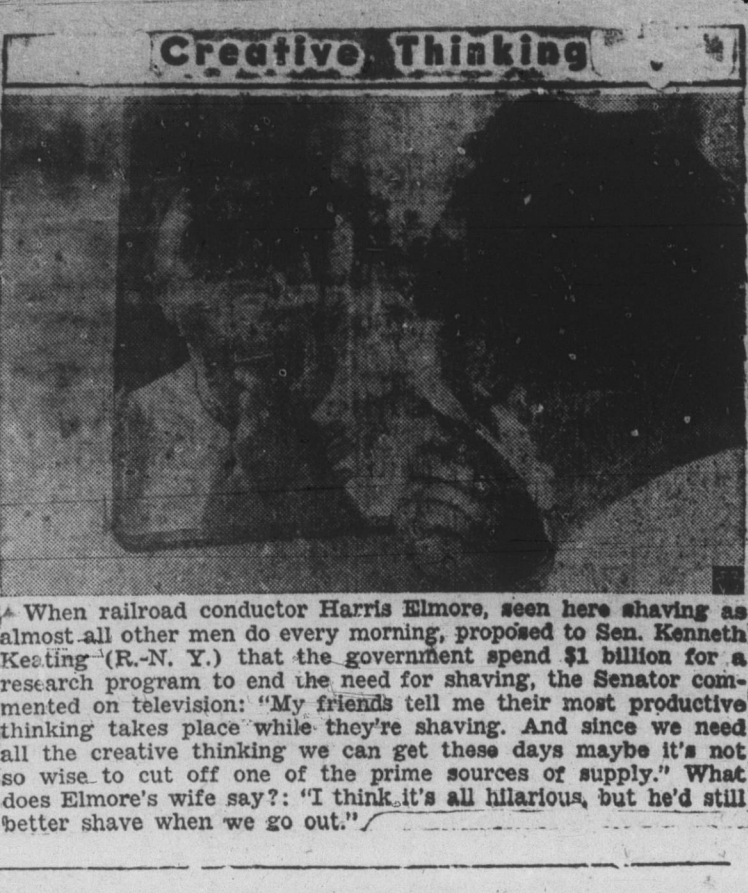
