Marine recruiter GySgt. C. A. Johnson Jr (today added that Women Marines are needed now as they were during the World War Il years. "We always need qualified young women who are single and between the ages of 18 and 36 to serve shoulder to shoulder with their male counterpart."

Sgt. Johnson added that the Marine Corps is now accepting applications for women who desire service with the elite Women Marines, and who are seeking travel and adventure throughout the world.

Sgt. Johnson maintains an office at the Asheville Post Office and will be on hand every weekday from 8 a. m. to 4:30 p. m. for those wishing to apply for enlist-ment or seeking further information without obligation.
