RAISED GRADE OF HIGHWAY

The State Highway Commission raised the grade of an established highway by a height of 12 feet. Smith had a home in Greensboro on property abutting the highway. Prior to the raising of the grade of the highway his property was level with the road. As a consequence of the grading of the highway his property was considerably lessened in value. His right of ingress and egress to the public highway was impaired or destroyed, unless ramps were constructed by him. Could Smith recover damages to the State Highway Commission?

No. This is a wrong done to a man for which the law provides no legal remedy.

This was an actual case decided by the Supreme Court of North Carolina in June of this year.

A jury in the superior court allowed Smith to recover a judgment of \$7,000, but the Supreme Court held that the trial judge erred in not granting the State Highway Commission a nonsuit at the close of the plaintiff's evidence.

The plaintiff had no cause of action, and the trial judge should not have let the case go to the jury.

The Supreme Court pointed out that the alterations in the grading of the highway were done entirely on the 100-foot right of way of an established highway.

Where a change of grade of a highway or street causes damage to the property of an abutting property owner, there is not deemed a "taking" in the constitutional sense so as to require compensation therefor as in eminent domain. This rule does not, however, apply to cases of partial takings, where damage to the remainder by reason of change of grade is involved.

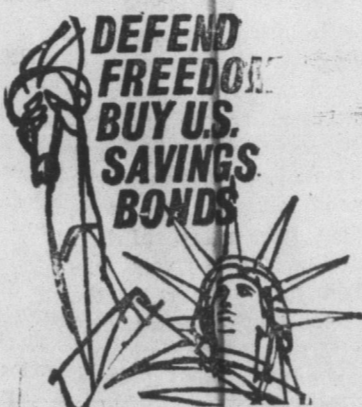
Second Annual Health Careers Congress To Be Held Feb. 8-9

DURHAM, N. C., Dec. 13—North Carolina's second annual Health Careers Congress for high school students throughout the State will be held here February 8-9, 1963. During a program of workshops and visits to medical institutions in the Durham-Chapel Hill area, the young people will be introduced to a variety of health professions.

Purpose of the Congress is to stimulate interest in health careers and to provide guidance in career selection and planning. Sponsoring agencies are the Health Careers Clubs of North Carolina, the N. C. League for Nursing and the N. C. Hospital League for Nursing and the N. C. Hospital Education and Research Foundation, Inc.

Students attending the Congress, to be headquartered in the Jack Tar Hotel here, will get a first-hand look at health professions by visiting the Duke University and University of North Carolina Medical Centers; and Watts and Lincoln Hospitals here.

At these institutions, the participants will see facilities and talk with personnel in fields that include medicine, nursing, physical therapy, pharmacy, dentistry, occupational therapy, X-ray technology, speech and hearing therapy.
