During the 1961 Christmas holiday, which covered a 78-hour period, North Carolina recorded 22 highway deaths in 20 fatal accidents and 730 injured in a total of 1,065 accidents. The largest number of deaths - 10 - occurred on Saturday, with 7 more on Christmas Eve, usually one of the most deadly days of the year because of traditional festivities and heavy travel to family
