

Yancey's Social Security Payoff New Totals \$66,550 Per Month

Monthly oldage, survivors disability insurance benefits in Yancey County now top \$66,556. Henry Horrocks social security representative, said this week.

The new monthly figure represents an overall increase of 10 percent over the corresponding last year.

This increase can be attributed to the changes inthe law in recent years, as well as the growth of our aged population." Horrocks said. "This money stimulates county business, as most of it is spent for food, clothing and shelter."

There is no longer any doubt, he said, that social securit ybenefits are helping to stabilize the incime and spending power of many residents in Yancey County.

Monthly benefits first became payable in January, 1940, and they have continued without interruption for 23 years, accompanied by a steady growth in the number of beneficiaries. Horrocks noted that as of December 31, 1962, some 1,608 people in Yancey County were collecting \$798,672 annually from social security.

Many additional people in Yancey County could draw socia lsecurity benefits if they knew mor eabout the socia lsecurity law. That is the reaso nthey are urged to secure an appointment with the social security representative, who visits Yancey County regularly, whenever they have a question concerning thei rbenefits or responsibilities.

Nationally more than 18 million beneficiaries are receving payments in excess of 1.2 billion dollars per month.




