key will strut North Carolina's colors in the National Turkey Show in Louisville, Ky., Jan. 6-10.

Governor Sanford issued the invitation to Tar Heel turkey growers after accepting a challenge from former Governor Bert Comb of Kentucky to enter a Tar Heel turkey in the national competition. Noting that North Carolina's farmers have raised 2,737,000 turkeys this year, Governor Sanford said: "We know that Tar Heel turkeys are the tastiest in the nation. We also know that they gobble as fine a tune as turkeys anywhere. And we suspect that they will win with the best in the country."

The Governor pointed out that North Carolina ranks 12th in the nation in total turkey production. State and federal agricultural records show the 1963 turkey production is up about 17 per cent. Governor Sanford said the increase in turkey production "means that more than 16,000 tons of turkey came off our farms this year. This is typical of the advances being made by North Carolina's food processing industry."

He said the rules for the turkey contest are simple: The turkey may be of any breed, sex or age. The one restriction in considering weight, the Governor noted, is that contest officials will not countenance feeding the turkeys buckshot.

The Governor asked turkey growers to write the vital statistics of their nominations to Wade Lucas, public information officer, State Department of Conservation and Development, Raleigh. The written nominations should include: Weight, breed, sex and age of turkey. Arrangements will be made to send the champion to Louisville.



New Road Signs Are Being Erected In Western N. C.

New signs are being installed on roads where weather and icy roads conditions exist, and to cover weather and icy roads conditions. The design and installation of the specially designed warning signs have been posted in the western part of North Carolina, and will be posted throughout the state in the following months. The design and installation of all highway traffic signs is the responsibility of the Traffic Department of the North Carolina State Highway Commission.

Two signs have been designed which read: ICE ON ROAD and CE ON BRIDGE. A convertible cap allows maintenance crews to display the sign when hazardous road conditions exist.
