

TB: the Problem that Won't Go Away

610,000 Americans still have active tuberculosis or are classified as "high risk" individuals.



A. 110,000 are known to have active tuberculosis.

B. 250,000 are recently recovered TB patients, many of whom are subject to relapse.

C. 250,000 are known to have had contact with new active TB cases recently reported.

610,000 persons, all told, are now in the TB pictureeither as actively ill patients or in the "high risk" category. Christmas Seal funds help provide the hope and the means of achieving ultimate control and eradication of tuberculosis in the U.S.
