RALIEGH, N. C. A recruitment program has been announced by the N. C. Merit System Council to fill an exciting vacancy for the position of Records and Procedures Analyst with the State Board of Health. All applicants must be college graduates and have two years of experience in teaching commercial or bookkeeping courses or two years accounting-clerical or statistical-clerical experience in a medical or public health agency. The salary range for this position of \$4,752 to \$6,024 per year.

An appointment to this position will be made from a register of eligibles of qualified applicants who successfully complete an appropriate competitive examination. Examinations for this position will be on April 15 in the Merit System office and on following Saturday in 15 centers located throughout the state.
