It is estimated that over 25 million, or more than one-third of all women over 14 years of age, work for pay away from home, in a family business, or on a family farm. Also these 25 million women make up onethird of all workers in this country.

More than half of the parttime workers are women, moreover, the number of these parttune women workers has increased more rapidly during the last ten years than the number of full-time women wo, kers

These women all have an important stake in Social Security. As a matter of fact, over \$1,000,000 women have earnings credited to their accounts in this program.

Women participate in the benefit provisions of the oldage. disability, and survivors

insurance program of the Social Security Act in a number of ways:

1) As a worker, a woman may become entitled to benefits if she becomes disabled.

2) A woman may become entitled to old-age insurance benefits at age 65 (or age of 62 at reduced rate).

3) As a worker. a woman may provide certain survivors benefits to members of her family when she dies.

4) As a dependent of another worker, she may become entited to survivors benefits upon the death of the worker.

With all these women actively in the work market, it is not uncommon for a woman to qualify for benefits on her der the Social Security proown account and that of a retired, disabled, or deceased worker. Of course, in that case Focial Security will not pay the full amount of both benefits. She will get her own benefit -- based on her work record - plus any difference between (rou'll keep the same numher own and that established on the record of another.

amendment to the present non-service connected disability and dependent pension law which allows certain changes in amounts of pension, also ce-tain disabled veterans drawing Aid and Attendance may be furnished certain medicines free by the Veterans Administration. This law will also permit certain veterans who served between October 8. 1940 and December 31, 1956 to apply or new insurance or add on to any service insurance they have up to a maximum amount of \$10,000. The new pension law changes went into effect on January 1, 1965, and the new insu ance cannot be granted until May 1, 1965, however these veterans will have until May 1, 1966 to apply.

If a veteran has any condition, disease or sickness as result of his or her service, and has not fied a claim they should contact the Veterana Service Officer and file as soon as possible. Veterans who establish service connection for injury. sickness or disease new insurance.
