WAMY COUNTIES TO RECEIVE TWENTY WORKERS

The North Carolina Fund announced today that Watauga, Avery, Mitchell and Yancey Counties have been selected to receive twenty North Carolina Volunteers to work in local summer service projects.

The Volunteers will arrive here June 17, after finishing a week of orientation and training at Duke University. They will be accompanied by adult advisors.

North Carolina Volunteers will be working in the four counties for local agencies including the public welfare departments, the public health departments, the public school system, and the Avery-Mitchell - Yancey Regional Library.

Communities where Vo'untee's will serve this summer were selected from numerous applicants by the Board of Directors of The North Carolina Fund. Last summer only community action programs funded by The North Carolina Fund were eligible to apply for Volunteers. This summer all community action programs in the state were eligible to submit proposals for North Caro'ina Volunteers.

The North Carolina Volunteers program was started in 1964 with 100 students participating. Six North Carolina communities were served. This year the program has been expanded and more than 250 Volunteers will be working in 17 project areas.




