ALCOHOL AND GOD

Wine is a mocker, strong drink is raging; and whosoever is deceived thereby is not wise. Proverbs 20:1.

Drinks containing alcohol are on a sharp rise in America. I would like for you to notice that our own part of this nation is under the influence of alcohol.

I am not going to say STOP drinking because YOU must make that decision for yourself. I should like to point out several things about alcohol. I have tried to find just one good point in drinking alcohol, but that point is not to be found. I will invite ANY person to point out any good effects of consuming alcohol. Even doctors will agree with what I have said in this article. And if you would like to have proof of this I can furnish it.

Many people seem to think that alcohol will stimulate. This is far from the truth. Instead of being a stimulant it is a DEPRESSANT. Now I have given you something to argue about. You may think that I don't know what I am talking about. You can bring up the argument that alcohol IS a stimulant because when a person is drunk he will talk more, sing, fight, laugh and be full of pep. The answer is this: a human brain has different parts, each of these parts has control over certain other body parts. There is a center in the brain that controls vision. When we see something our eyes pick up the image and send this information to the part of our brain that is responsible for our vision. For an example, we may be walking along a road, and out in front of us we see a hole in the road. This hole may be deep or wide and we can't cross it. Our eyes pick up the image and flash the message to the brain, the part of the brain that receives this image then flashes a signal to another part of the brain which in turn tells our legs to stop.

Our brain controls our body. It makes no difference what

the movements are that we make other than reflexes, our brain is in control.

There is another part of the brain. In this part we have a general control center. This control center actually controls the other parts of the brain. This is like a control room in a radio station. Things originating in other studios are controlled from the control room. This control center is actually depressed from alcohol, thus, letting the other parts run free. This is like letting the brakes off an auto. The car does not have any extra energy but only appears to have.

Alcohol is a cerebral depressant. It depresses in progressive order in the brain. The higher functions, such as reason and judgment are affected before movements are.

acreage of allotted crops, according to J. T. Randolph, Office Manager for the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Office. These reporters will also measure acreages diverted from production under the feed grain and wheat stabilization programs.

Randolph said that these reporters have been well trained and are well qualified to make accurate determinations. Generally the acreage determinations will be made by the use of aerial photographs. This system has proven to be very accurate and the most practical means of measuring crops.

These acreage determinations are very important to each farmer. They determine a farmer's eligibility for price support on the allotted crops and his eligibility for payment under the diversion programs.

Randolph urges all farmers to cooperate with these reporters so that they may do the most accurate job possible. In many cases where errors are made the farmer is not available to assist the reporter. The farmer's help is especially important so that he may point out all areas that are not planted to the crop. With each farmer's help, these reporters can and will do a very accurate job.
