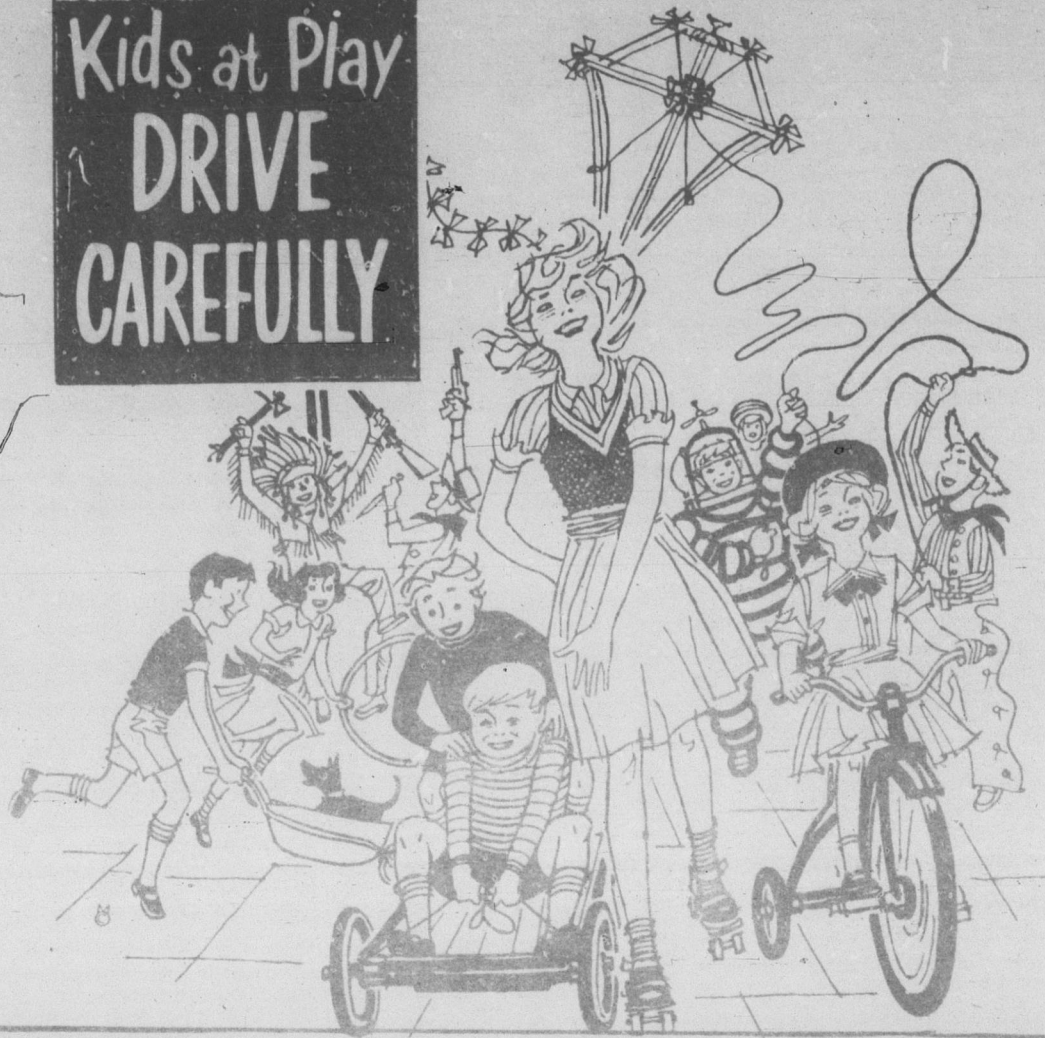
The club then enjoyed a skit "The Ghost Convention" concerning electrical faults, hazards, do's and don't's in the home.

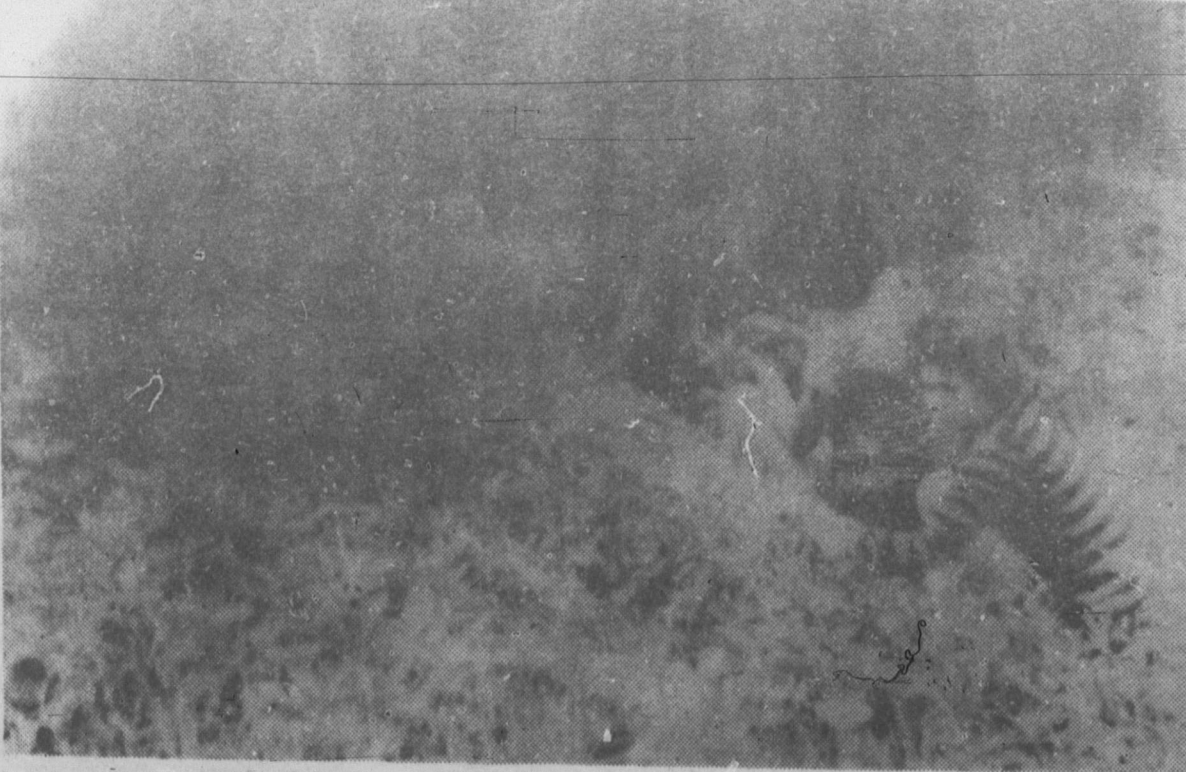
Sgt. Radford is with the 98th Strategic Aerospace Wing.
