drive or is obsessed with it makes little difference. In either case it is sick, and American society of the sixties is very sick indeed.

For some reason or other Americans seem convinced that sex is an evil pleasure which they are determined to enjoy in spite of God. Why it does not occur to them that God must know about sex if He created it, and that He must have thought it all right if He created it, is a? mystery which still awaits a solution.
