

WARREN WILSON COLLEGE HOMECOMING OCT. 16

The tenth annual homecoming observance at Warren Wilson College, Swannanoa, North Carolina, will be held Saturday, October 16. The day's activities begin with registration at 10 a. m. in Gladfelter Building, the student union, while the final event of the day is a dance and social hour at 8:30 p. m. also in Gladfelter, sponsored by the undergraduates and to which the alumni are invited.

Sergeant McInturff is an aircraft electrical repairman at Goose, AB, Canada. His team is representing the Air Defense Command (ADC) in the biennial competition.

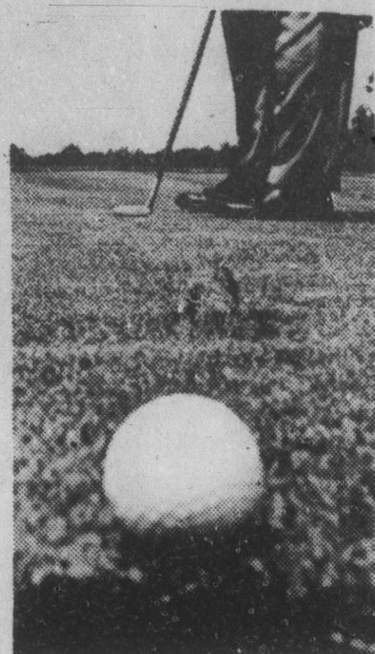
