NO SLIPPER FOR CIN-DERELLA by Mildred Lawrence. The heroine, Merial Chapin, thought she was in dire need of a fairy godmother; but it wasn't either pumpkins or magic wands which transformed Merial.

THE TWIN SERPENTS by Ronald Scott Thorn. The pace mounts from page to page in this suspenseful and highly literate thriller, which gives a new twist to the coiled serpents climbing the rod of Mercury, long the emblem of physicians and surgeons.

A CARIBBE. N MYSTERY by Agatha Christie. A short "Miss Marple" novel. Most of the readers of Agatha Christie will in the end ask themselves how they could have been so blind—or how Agatha Christie could have fooled them again.

SHADOW OF A MAN by Doris Miles Disney. In her latest novel she demonstrates the versatility that has made her one of the most exciting and talented writers in the field of mystery fiction.

THOMAS by Shelley Mydans. A novel of the life, passion and miracles of Becket, one of the most complex religious and political figures of the Middle Ages. His brilliant life and notorious murder are masterfully re-created in this distinguished novel.

SFCOND SPRING AND TWO POTATOES by Ilka Chase. An amusing journey to the South Seas, Australia and South Africa, with photos.

THE WASTED AMERI-CANS. Edgar May, a Pulitzer-pr'ze-winning journalist, looks deep into our welfare problems to see why millions of Americans are living on relief in the middle of affluence.
